Aviation

2. Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport General Aviation Facility Management Agreement with Signature Flight Support, LLC to add one year to the term, effective March 1, 2026. Funding: This item is projected to result in additional revenue of \$143,255 in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Operating Budget of Austin Aviation.
3. Authorize negotiation and execution of a building and ground lease with Federal Express Corporation for approximately 76,757 square feet of the cargo building at 9301 Cargo Ave., Austin, Texas 78719, 146,033 square feet of the airport cargo apron area, 79,333 square feet of the cargo handling area, 163,465 square feet of parking area, and 11,448 square feet of equipment storage area at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport, for a term of 10 years, commencing on

January 1, 2026. Funding: This item is projected to be revenue neutral in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Austin Aviation Operating Budget. The item consolidates the tenant's existing contracts related to the lease and use of cargo apron areas and cargo handling areas into a new 10-year agreement. Accordingly, the tenant's projected total rental revenue is unchanged for Fiscal Year 2025-2026.

Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the legal services agreement with Richards Rodriguez & Skeith for representation of the City of Austin and several individual officers in *Glen and Mindy Shield v. City of Austin*, No. 1:25-cv-01210-DAE, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, Austin Division in the amount of \$455,500 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$609,500. Funding: Available in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Liability Reserve Budget.

5. Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the Austin Travis County Mental Health Mental Retardation Center, d/b/a Integral Care, for the Expanded Mobile Crisis Outreach Team, which offers a first response team for mental health crises in collaboration with City first responders, to add funding in an amount not to exceed \$2,086,033, and increase funding for the two remaining extension options in an amount not to exceed \$2,086,033 per extension option, for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$24,044,584. Funding: \$2,086,033 is available in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Austin Community Court Operating Budget. Funding for the remaining years of the agreement is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.
6. Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the Austin-Travis County Sobriety Center Local Government Corporation, d/b/a The Sobering Center, to increase the funding provided by the City related to the provision of clinical oversight at The Sobering Center through a funding increase in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 and increased funding for the two remaining extension options in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 per extension option, for a revised total contract amount not to exceed \$12,792,433. Funding: \$500,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Operating Budget of Austin Community Court. Funding for the remaining years of the agreement is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

7. Authorize expenditures for annual renewals of professional dues and memberships in national and state associations and organizations related to the electric utility industry, in an amount not to exceed \$510,000. Funding: \$510,000 is available in the Operating Budget of Austin Energy.
8. Approve an ordinance repealing and reserving City Code Section 15-9-5 (Deposit or Bond for Infrastructure Improvements) relating to deposit or bond requirements for electric utility infrastructure improvements. Funding: This item has no fiscal impact.

11. 12. Approve a resolution re-appointing Darrell Alexander, Kimberly Olivares, Jason Alexander, Michael Gates, and Joseph Gonzales to the board of directors of the Austin Public Facilities Corporation for a partial term to end December 31, 2026, and then, in order to align term ending dates with the rest of the board members, appointing the same members to full three-year terms, ending December 31, 2029, and appointing Dr. Eric Johnson to a new three-year term beginning January 1, 2027, and ending December 31, 2029. Funding for the remaining years of the agreement is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

- revised amount not to exceed \$348,175 for the 12-month term ending on September 30, 2026, and to add five percent, compounded annually, to each of the remaining two extension options, for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$1,931,866. Funding: \$348,175 is available in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Austin Housing Department Special Revenue Budget. Funding for the remaining years of the agreement is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.
42.
